

Legislative Report for MSTA

This past summer, contractors represented by the Michigan Infrastructure and Transportation Association (MITA) turned away members of the Operating Engineers 324 at road building job sites across the state. "This is a defensive lockout following months of disruptive, coercive and unlawful activities by the union", Mike Nystrom, president of MITA said. He said, "The Operating Engineers have refused to meet since June 1 when their contract expired."

In June, the Operating Engineers opted to go around MITA and negotiate labor arguments with the individual contractors represented by MITA. Nystrom contended the head of the union has simply authored a contract which was not negotiated with anyone and submitted it to the U.S. Department of Labor. Following a three hour road construction shutdown on I-96 waged by Operating Engineers picketers, MITA contractors agreed to the defensive lockout and MITA then informed the union by letter of action.

The Operating Engineers put the blame at MITA's feet, arguing the association is endangering hundreds of road work projects across the state with its hostile plan for involuntary layoffs. "This involuntary layoff of the dedicated men and women rebuilding our roads and bridges is a hostile act by the Michigan Infrastructure and Transportation Association" said Dan McKernan, spokesman for Operating Engineers 324. "Millions of drivers are about to pay the price of MITA's short-sighted greed as road projects are turned over to untrained workers to go unfinished. The next time you're stuck in a traffic jam on I-75 or blow out a tire on I-96 you can thank MITA for not valuing your time or safety." The operating engineers argue that their 15,000 members have worked through the summer despite some MITA contractors' refusal to sign a contract.

Nystrom said the industry offered the union a five year contract that would have resulted in a 14 percent wage increase in the Operating Engineers wage of \$55.67 an hour. "Not all projects are going to shut down", Nystrom said. "This is a situation where many projects will continue with other trades. It's only operating engineers being locked out. Laborers, cement layers and other workers will continue to work."

A frustrated Governor Rick Snyder recently announced that the Michigan National Guard could be brought in to help finish work on high traffic stretches of freeway. Mike Nystrom, VP of MITA, which represents the contractors in the dispute with Operating Engineers Local 324, is in talks with the military and it might be possible that members of the Michigan National Guard could be at work on construction sites. Governor Snyder commented that the development would be unprecedented in Michigan and possibly the nation. The contractors have the heavy equipment and the National Guard has the heavy equipment operators said Snyder. The spokesman for Local 324 said the idea of using the National Guard is ridiculous. Though skilled, National Guard members don't have the necessary experience in freeway construction and should not be expected to intervene in a labor dispute, Local 324 spokesman Dan McKernan said.

Once Governor Snyder announced the possibility of bringing in the Michigan National Guard to work on road projects, MITA representing the contractors and The Operating Engineers Local 324 representing union members now have a tentative agreement to continue working without a contract through the 2018 construction season. The two groups have agreed to mediation through the winter. The breakthrough came after the Snyder administration stepped up pressure on both sides telling contractors they could face monetary damages for late completion of projects and telling the union the governor was considering bringing in machine operators from the Michigan National Guard to resume work, which could still happen.

is the center of government and the Legislature in Michigan. Nearly every industry in the state has an association that is represented by their employee lobbyist or a contract lobbyist. Downtown Lansing is full of association and advocacy groups because a headquarters near the Capitol allows easy access to legislators, state officials and staff who set budgets, write policy and legislation and draft regulations.

The number of lobbyists has steadily increased since 1998 when there were 2,202 lobbyists and lobbying agencies registered in Michigan. In 2017 there were 2,954 registered lobbyists. Total lobbyist spending in 2007 was \$31.2 million and in 2017 \$39.4 million. The biggest lobby House in Michigan spent more than \$1.6 million on lobbying last year, according to campaign finance records. The advocacy/lobbying world has grown since the state adopted term limits for state legislators in 1998. Lobbyists have to work harder to teach new rounds of politicians about their causes and to build good working relationships with new legislators/staff in a short amount of time which is crucial to doing a good job. Credibility is the only thing a lobbyist has to sell a government official.

If you have ever called your state representative, state senator or your city councilman and asked him/her to do anything by way of public policy you have "lobbied". The difference is that if you get paid to advocate or ask an elected official to do something you have to register under the Lobby Registration Act. Groups hire lobbyists because they need to activate the political system. Our job is to educate legislators and government officials about clients and their issues. The legislative process may seem frustrating and disappointing and can be complex. The lobbyist is the middle person between the client and legislators who provide credibility, thus open doors that might otherwise remain closed. Effective lobbying is achieved through credibility which can only be earned and is the key element in getting a client's story told and supported. The five basic elements to lobbying are fact finding, monitoring, lobbying, credibility and access.

The Michigan political scene has heated to a boiling point. Campaigning and campaign ads have gone over the top. The race for governor between Gretchen Whitmer, D-East Lansing and Bill Schuette, R-Midland is getting closer, but Gretchen Whitmer appears to still be in the lead.

New polling indicates possible tossups in certain legislative races.....

Kelly Rossman-McKinney, the Democratic 24th Senate District nominee, is leading against Republican Rep. Tom Barrett, R-Potterville. Public relations professional Kelly is leading with both men and women and independents.

In the Upper Peninsula's 38th Senate District, Rep. Scott Dianda, D-Calumet is in a dead heat with Republican Ed McBroom, R-Vulcan.

The traditionally Republican 10th Senate District competition, where newcomer Michael MacDonald (R) is running against Rep. Henry Yanez, D-Sterling Heights, is in a dead heat.

A toss up in Oakland County between Mallory McMorrow (D) and Senator Marty Knollenberg, R-Troy is in play. Some Republican Oakland County and Macomb County seats are in jeopardy this election cycle.

A toss up in Grand Rapids between Rep. Winnie Brinks, D-Grand Rapids and Rep. Chris Afendoulis, R-Grand Rapids for the Kent county Senate seat is also in play.

It is important that you exercise your American liberty by voting Election Day. Just do it!
